A NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE MINISTER

Jesus took full advantage of ministry opportunities. Consider the story of Zachaeus. Zachaeus was searching for spiritual meaning in life. Today, many Canadians are spiritually open. Sociologist Reg Bibby says, "At a time when only 26% of Canadians are saying that religion is 'very

90% of Canadians maintain that God either continues to be 'important' or is becoming 'more important.' important' to them, about 90% maintain that God either continues to be 'important' or is becoming 'more important.' Make no mistake about it: God is doing well in the polls." Jesus was willing to risk reaching someone who was not accepted in the religious culture. He looked at Zachaeus

sitting on the limb of

a Sycamore tree and said, "Zachaeus, come down immediately, I must stay at your house today" (Luke 19:5). The meeting with Zachaeus was a "divine" appointment. Notice this encounter did not take

place in church. The crowd was very upset when Jesus decided to go home with this notorious person.

Reaching unchurched people requires a willingness to spend time with people who are not like us. According to Rick Meigs, "Missional

churches take the words of Jesus seriously when he said, "Go and be... (disciples). Such churches try to move beyond the 'come and see' approach to ministry." Reaching people for Christ in our culture requires a willingness to move out of our church buildings and into the lives of people who are spiritually hungry. Zachaeus had a life-changing encounter because Jesus was willing to enter his world and engage him where he lived. Jesus said, "Today salvation has come to this house... For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost" (Luke 19:9-10). Many people who are not interested in going to church are open to a spiritual encounter with God.

The question remains, "Are we willing to step outside our comfort zone and take the risk?"


