The ministry's emphasis is on networking, building friendship bridges and training leaders. The long range goal is to plant a self-supporting mandarin speaking Chinese Baptist Church in Fredericton.

TRANSITION TEAM

At Oasis 2011 our churches bravely embraced change and a strong vision for future ministry in Atlantic Canada as delegates voted in favor of the Senior Staff Restructuring Proposal (www.baptistatlantic.ca/departments/executiveminister) brought forward by the Council.

This will involve a transition process that will last until July 2013 when the new staffing arrangement will be fully implemented. Four of our present Regional Ministers will retire at the end of 2011. Working closely with the Executive Minister, Dr. Malcolm Beckett and the remaining Regional Ministers (Rev. Elias Mutale, Rev. Jerry Horsman, and Rev. Greg Jones) will make up the new transition team.



Cince its inception in 1960, the vision of the Baptist Bookroom in Saint John, NB, has been to provide our Convention and the surrounding community with Christ-centered resources (bibles, books, music and videos) for salvation and spiritual growth.

Over the years pastors, churches and individuals have had access to resources that have enhanced the ministry of churches in

our Convention. As well, the Bookroom has been spiritually profitable in that many lives have been touched and the Kingdom of God has been expanded beyond denominational lines.

In the early years, the Bookroom operated out of the Convention Office. By 1977, demand grew

to provide more books and resources so the **Bookroom** moved into a store front location on Germain Street. In the years that followed, they moved three more times (Loch Lomond Mall, Parkway Mall and its current location on McAllister Drive).

Providing resources is only a part of the ministry of the **Bookroom**. Bookroom Manager Heather Goodwin commented, "We have had many opportunities to share Christ with those who have been searching as well as pray for and encourage Christians who have shared their concerns." Heather has witnessed the ups and downs in the retail market but knows the spiritual benefits cannot be weighed. "The ministry of the Baptist Bookroom has been a wide reaching one and only eternity will reveal what has been accomplished over the many years."

The **Baptist Bookroom** will close its doors on December 31, 2011. We have sought ways to extend the life and ministry of the **Bookroom**
