#### **Income Sources for Refugee Families**

The federal government does not contribute 50% of the settlement costs in their 6 months to the newcomers. The rate of support compares with local social assistance rates. The following information we understand to be accurate:

- Any family that arrives in Canada between November March will be met at their point of entry (airport) and presented with winter coat, boots, etc. This will replace the winter clothing allowance\*. Any family that arrives April – October will be eligible for the winter clothing allowance.
- CIC will email you in conjunction with the arrival of your refugee family and let you know the amount of income the family can expect to receive during their 6 months of \*RAP support (Resettlement Assistance Program [months 2 7]).
- You should not anticipate that the government will reimburse you for any start-up costs. These should be included in your budget as part of your costs for sponsorship. These expenses may include (but not be limited to): first month rent and damage deposit, home furnishings, furniture, first grocery order, winter clothing upon arrival, school supplies for school age children. Many of these items can be received as in-kind donations.
- All cash donations that are processed through a church are eligible for a tax receipt.
- Families with children may also be eligible for the following income assistance:

RAP Support: We have a copy of a CIC document that shows the rates for RAP Support. This will help you group with budget preparation (see below).

• If the RAP support is not sufficient to cover the costs for the family (along with other possible income streams) than the sponsoring group may need to supplement their income during the 6 months of RAP support.

You will be responsible to create a reasonable budget for the family that you'll sponsor. This should be based on real costs for housing, transportation, groceries, utilities and other monthly expenses. Please be sure to include some spending money.

- Part of your role will be to teach them how to live on this budget with their projected monthly income, introduce them to our Canadian currency and assist them with budgeting as they get settled into Canada.
  - Note newcomers will open their own bank account and all of their funds will be deposited directly into their account. They will pay their own bills and ultimately be responsible for the management of their own funds.

- 2. fleeing an abusive situation until the issues related to the abuse have been addressed. This is limited to court processess, and/or counseling related to the abuse
- ${\it 3. }\ has\ a\ chronic\ mental,\ cognitive\ or\ physical\ condition\ that\ limits\ participation\ in\ employment$
- 4. is 55 years of age or over; or
- 5. is a youth aged 16-18
