CONVERSATION WITH NEW CANADIANS

Our "Traditional Canadian Thanksgiving Dinner" to new Canadians went incredibly well. We didn't make it a "ticketed" event, so we had no way to gauge the number of people coming in advance. We decided 150 was the maximum we could accommodate over the course of two shifts (hosted at the Salvation Army). So in faith we prepared a meal for that many. We had over thirty volunteers preparing and serving through the whole day, and a crowd began gathering before we even opened the doors. In the foyer, greeters served punch and welcomed people as they gathered and waited for a table. In the end we served almost 120 people from China, Iran, Bhutan, Japan, South Africa, and perhaps others. It was very well received and a lot of fun!



That in itself was a huge thrill for our church, and it increased our passion and vision for what God may be doing.

As people left the meal we handed out invitations to an English conversation group to be held a few days later. On Thursday night we opened the doors not knowing how many we might see. In the end we filled our classroom to capacity with 21 guests plus our volunteer conversation partners. Based on the feedback we got, many of the guests will return again and bring friends.



We're moving quickly and putting things together as we go, but we have a clear sense of God's leading. This success is only a result of months of prayer, research, and building relationships. We're off to a great start! :)
