

TRIUMPH IN TRANSITION



Jerry Reddy has been Senior Pastor of Hillside Baptist Church in Moncton, NB since 1993. During this time, Jerry and the leadership have navigated the congregation through the ongoing demands of transitioning into the future. He is not naïve about the difficulty for local churches to have a viable and sustained ministry. In a day when many churches are in decline, Jerry is committed to guide the Hillside community to be a "welcoming neighborhood church in their region."

This commitment comes with a cost. In the past 9 years the congregation has invested 2.5 million dollars in new construction and renovations. Jerry's conviction about buildings is clear: *"It is not about facilities, but rather, about ministry that is facilitated."* He saw the old facilities as "a lid on their potential to be a redemptive presence." The list of improvements and additions includes a new preschool wing, youth cafe, and expanded lobby.

But the cost is more than monetary. When asked about the personal price of leadership, Jerry quipped, *"Success only precedes work in the dictionary."* Taking a church through such transitions requires balancing administration with relationship. Ultimately, it means guiding the church leadership to a new level of risk.

ABY Celebrates 80 Years

Since 1930, the Atlantic Baptist Youth (ABY) executive has faithfully served the youth in our region. Previously known as the Atlantic United Baptist Youth Convention (AUBYC), the ABY was created to provide opportunities for youth to SERVE Atlantic Canadian youth, to CONNECT with other Christian leaders, and to LEAD at a regional level.

Chad Stretch (PEI representative, 1960's) remembers the feeling of working and serving together as a team. "We learned and grew knowing that everything we accomplished as an executive was through the Lord's work, and that He had His hand in everything."

Current CABYC President, Bob Kowaleski, served as AUBYC President exactly 20 years ago. He recalls one executive meeting, "we were having a prayer time and one member was a bit sleepy. Her snoring got progressively louder to the point where everyone just started laughing which woke her and ended our prayer time."

The tradition of serving, connecting, and leading has continued up to the present day. Each member has a specific role as they plan events and develop tools for youth and youth ministries. Elected every two years, the ex-

ecutive provides leadership for youth events sponsored by the CABYC - the Senior High track at Springforth, the Tidal Impact Mission Program and other young adult initiatives.

Chet MacPhail, a former PEI representative, ALBYC President, and ABY advisor, reflects on the continuing impact of the executive.

"Some amazing leaders and more amazing blessings have come out of our Youth Convention, and God has always used it as a vehicle to proclaim Christ to Atlantic Canada and beyond. The ABY executive formed much of the ground work upon which the vital ministry to youth and families is continually being built today."
